Pursuant to Article 10 of the Statute of the Foundation "Register of National Internet Domain Names of Serbia", the Conference of Co-founders of the Foundation "Register of National Internet Domain Names of Serbia", at its sessions of 28th May and 24th December 2011 in Belgrade, has passed the following:

GENERAL TERMS FOR THE REGISTRATION OF A CYRILLIC COUNTRY CODE TOP-LEVEL INTERNATIONALISED DOMAIN NAME .cp6 <xn--90a3ac>

Subject of the General Terms Article 1

The General Terms for the Registration of a Cyrillic Internationalised Internet Domain in the .cp6 domain space (hereinafter: General Terms) prescribe the registration process and the use of an internationalised Internet domain in the .cp6 domain space (hereinafter: .cp6 domain), as well as the relationship between the Register of National Internet Domain Names of Serbia (hereinafter: RNIDS), as the administrator of the central register of the .cp6 domain (hereinafter: .cp6 IDN ccTLD registry) and users of .cp6 domains (hereinafter: "registrants") who register .cp6 domains with RNIDS through accredited registrars of .cp6 domains (hereinafter: "accredited registrars").

Definitions of primary terms Article 2

(1) *The Internet* is a global communications system comprising a large number of interconnected autonomous systems (networks), which exchange data using a common set of communications protocols (TCP/IP).

(2) *IP address* is a numerical identifier, defined as part of the IP protocol, which which allows unique addressing of devices connected to the Internet.

(3) the *Internationalised Cyrillic Internet domain name* is a textual label which identifies a set of devices or Internet services, linking them into a single administrative and technical unit. A domain name consists of a series of alphanumerical segments, concatenated by dots, in line with the Internet standards RFC 1034, 1035, 1122, 1123 and 3596 and the standards which supplement or replace them. The label of a Cyrillic internationalised Internet domain name may contain numbers (0-9), letters of the Serbian Cyrillic alphabet (a-III) and hyphens (-). A segment may not contain a hyphen at the start or at the end. A segment may not contain two consecutive hyphens in the third and fourth positions. All Cyrillic internationalised domain names must undergo a process called ASCII Compatible Encoding (ACE) which is described in RFC 3490. A segment of a Cyrillic internationalized Internet domain may contain a maximum of 63 ASCII characters after ACE.

(4) *The .cp6 domain* is the internationalised Cyrillic Internet domain which is formed according to the rules given in point (3) of this article.

(5) *The Domain Name System (DNS)* is a base Internet service which translates domain names into IP addresses and vice-versa.

(6) The .cp6 IDN ccTLD is the highest level domain in the DNS system, intended for the

registration of .cp6 domain names, for the territory of the Republic of Serbia.

(7) *The .cp6 IDN ccTLD registry* is the central database of .cp6 domains registered within the .cp6 IDN ccTLD, which is managed by RNIDS.

(8) *The WHOIS database of the .cp6 IDN ccTLD registry* is a publicly accessible database of users of .cp6 domain registered within the cp6 IDN ccTLD registry.

Definitions of registrant, administrative and technical contact Article 3

(1) A registrant is a person who, in accordance with the provisions of these General Terms, registers and uses a .cp6 domain within the .cp6 IDN ccTLD registry.

(2) A registrant may be a local or foreign individual or legal entity.

(3) An administrative contact is an individual, a citizen of the Republic of Serbia, or a legal entity with a registered office in the Republic of Serbia authorised to receive information from RNIDS significant to the registration on behalf of the registrant and to make changes to all information regarding the registration of the .cp6 domain name on behalf of the registrant.

(4) A technical contact is an individual or legal entity authorised to make changes to technical information relating to the registration of a .cp6 domain name (DNS server information and changes to the person appointed as the technical contact) on behalf of the registrant.

Definition of accredited registrar Article 4

(1) An accredited registrar is a legal entity or sole trader with a registered office in the Republic of Serbia who has been granted authority by RNIDS to carry out .cp6 domain registrations within the .cp6 IDN ccTLD registry.

(2) An accredited registrar carries out the tasks of .cp6 domain registration at the request of a registrant.

(4) The tasks of .cp6 domain registration are: registering .cp6 domain names, modifying .cp6 domain name registration information, .cp6 domain registration renewals, transferring .cp6 domain between accredited registrars, transferring .cp6 domain registrations, activating privacy protection for contact information for .cp6 domains and revoking .cp6 domains.

(4) The operation of accredited registrars is regulated in more detail by the General Terms of Operation of Accredited .cp6 Domain Registrars and other regulatory documents of RNIDS.

Organisation of domain extensions of the .cp6 IDN ccTLD registry

(1) .cp6 domains within the .cp6 ID ccTLD registry are registered in the following five toplevel and second-level domains:

1 .cp6 – intended for all interested users;

2 .пр.срб – intended for business users;

3 .opr.cp6 – intended for all other users who are legal entities;

4 .обр.срб - intended for educational institutions and organisations;

5 .од.срб – intended for users who are individuals

6 .aĸ.cpб (delegated) – intended for academic and research network of Serbia;

7 .упр.срб (delegated) – intended for state institutions of the Republic of Serbia.

(2) RNIDS may at a later date allow the registration of .cp6 domains in other second-level domains within the .cp6 IDN ccTLD registry.

(3) These General Terms do not cover the registration of second-level domains which have been delegated and other new second-level domains which may be delegated to third parties.

(4) RNIDS may be a registered domain holder within the .cp6 IDN ccTLD and has the right to register or reserve .cp6 domains for its own use and domains of special significance for the Republic of Serbia, as well as domains necessary for the stable functioning of Internet services.

Submitting an application to register a .cp6 domain Article 6

(1) RNIDS shall register a .cp6 domain on the basis of a submitted application for the registration of a .cp6 domain, in accordance with these General Terms.

(2) A registrant may register multiple .cp6 domains within the .cp6 IDN ccTLD registry

(3) A separate application for the registration of a .cp6 domain is submitted for each .cp6 domain name.

(4) In submitting an application for the registration of a .cp6 domain name, the registrant explicitly acknowledges that he or she is familiar with the contents of these General Terms.

(5) RNIDS reserves the right to temporarily stop or limit the registration of a .cp6 domain if deemed necessary to protect the technical and administrative functioning of the .cp6 IDN ccTLD registry.

Registration information of .cp6 domains Article 7

(1) The registrant, when submitting a .cp6 domain registration application, must provide accurate, full and current information about the registration of the .cp6 domain.

(2) The registration details for .cp6 domains are:

- if the registrant or administrative contact is an individual: name and surname, address, citizen's ID number, administrative and technical contact and information on the primary

and secondary DNS server for the .cp6 domain name being registered;

- if the registrant or administrative contact is a legal entity or sole trader: business name, address, company registration number, tax number (optional), administrative and technical contact and information on the primary and secondary DNS server for the .cp6 domain name being registered.

(3) The registrant must, for the duration of the registration of the .cp6 domain, keep the DNS servers operational.

(4) If any of the .cp6 domain name registration information changes, the registrant must immediately, at the latest within 15 days, via the accredited registrar, submit to RNIDS an application for amendment of the .cp6 domain information.

(5) RNIDS may at any time verify the accuracy of .cp6 domain name registration information by sending a message to the e-mail address of the registrant and technical contact, and it is the registrant's or administrative contact's duty to confirm the information within 15 days.

Declaration of good intentions and responsibility of the registrant Article 8

(1) By submitting an application for the registration of a .cp6 domain within the .cp6 IDN ccTLD registry, or by accepting these General Terms, the registrant explicitly declares and certifies that, to the best of his or her knowledge and belief, the registration of the desired .cp6 domain name does not infringe others' intellectual property rights or other subjective right, and that all information provided in the application is truthful and complete. The registrant also declares that the .cp6 domain name is not being registered contrary to the principles of good faith, honesty and good business practice, and that the .cp6 domain name will not knowingly be used contrary to these principles.

(2) RNIDS assumes no responsibility for any damages which may arise from the provision of incorrect .cp6 domain name registration information as well as from the unauthorised or illegal use of a .cp6 domain.

Registration and activation of .cp6 domains Article 9

(1) RNIDS carries out the registration of .cp6 domain names on a first-come, first-serve basis.

(2) The registrant has the priority right to the .cp6 domain he or she has applied to register the moment RNIDS receives his or her application to register a .cp6 domain after which RNIDS issues confirmation that the .cp6 domain registration application has been received.

(3) A .cp6 domain is registered when RNIDS enters the .cp6 domain in the WHOIS database for the .cp6 IDN ccTLD registry.

(4) the WHOIS database for the . IDN ccTLD registry contains the following minimum information about each registered .cp6 domain:

1 the .cpб domain name;

- 2 registration information for the .cp6 domain;
- 3 date and time of registration of the .срб domain;
- 4 date and time of expiry of the .cpб domain;
- 5 name of the accredited registrar responsible for the .cp6 domain name.

(5) RNIDS must activate a .cp6 domain at the latest within twenty-four hours from sending confirmation of receipt of the .cp6 domain name registration application.

(6) The deadline in the previous paragraph may be extended in exceptional circumstances when RNIDS temporarily stops or limits the processing of .cp6 domain name registration applications as outlined in article 6, paragraph (5).

(7) A .cp6 domain is active when RNIDS enters the details from the WHOIS database into the DNS table of the .cp6 IDN ccTLD registry and makes the table active on the primary DNS server.

Accessibility of information on registered .cp6 domains Article

10

(1) RNIDS shall always make the following information about registered .cp6 domains within the .cp6 IDN ccTLD registry available through the WHOIS database:

1 the .cpб domain name;

2 date and time of registration of the .cp6 domain;

date and time of the last change made to the registration information of the .cp6 domain;

4 date and time of expiry of the .cpδ domain;

5 name of the accredited registrar responsible for the .cp6 domain name;

6 current status of the .cpб domain name (active, deactivated, disputed, in arbitration, etc.);

7 DNS servers for the .cp6 domain name

(2) The contact details for a .cp6 domain are:

1 if the registrant is an individual: name and surname, address, administrative contact and technical contact;

2 if the registrant is a legal entity or sole-trader: business name, registered office, company registration number, tax number, administrative contact and technical contact.

(3) RNIDS shall make following minimum contact information for every registered .cp6 domain name available through the WHOIS database as long as the registrant has not activated contact information privacy protection:

1 if the registrant is an individual: name and surname;

2 if the registrant is a legal entity or sole trader: business name, registered office and company registration number.

(4) RNIDS, on receiving a request with rationale, must provide any interested party with the contact details for a .cp6 domain name within three days of the day of receipt of the request.

(5) RNIDS, on a registrant's request for privacy protection of .cp6 domain name contact information, must disable access to the contact information for the .cp6 domain name for which the request was submitted.

(6) RNIDS must allow appropriate government bodies access to all information about .cp6 domain names registered within the .cp6 IDN ccTLD registry in accordance with law or court orders issued in accordance with law.

Duration of registration of .cpб domains Article 11

(1) .cp6 domain names are registered for a period of between one and 10 years with the possibility of renewing the registration.

(2) .cp6 domain names are registered and renewed for whole years.

Changing .cpб domain registration information Article 12

(1) The registrant, or a person authorised by him or her, submits a request to change .cp6 domain name registration details to RNIDS through the accredited registrar responsible for the .cp6 domain name.

(2) RNIDS issues confirmation of receipt of the request to change .cp6 domain registration information.

RNIDS must activate changes to .cp6 domain information within no more than 24 hours of confirming receipt of the request to change .cp6 domain name registration information.

(5) Changes to registration information for a .cp6 domain name are registered when RNIDS enters the changes into the WHOIS database of the .cp6 ID ccTLD registry.

(5) RNIDS has the right to change all details of an existing .cp6 domain name on the basis of a legally binding judicial decision, the final decision of an arbitration council in disputes concerning .cp6 domains or if the change is necessary for maintaining the technical stability of the Internet.

Renewing a .cp6 domain Article 13

(1) The registrant, the administrative contact or the technical contact may submit a request to renew the registration of a .cp6 domain name to RNIDS through the accredited registrar responsible for the .cp6 domain name.

(2) RNIDS issues confirmation that it has received the request to renew the registration of a .cp6 domain name.

(3) RNIDS must renew the registration of a .cp6 domain name within no more than twentyfour hours of confirming receipt of the request to renew the registration of the .cp6 domain name.

(4) The renewal of the registration of a .cp6 domain name is registered when RNIDS enters the renewal into the WHOIS database of the .cp6 IDN ccTLD registry.

(5) It is also possible to renew the registration of .cp6 domain names before their expiry, but the maximum total number of years for which a .cp6 domain can be registered is 10 years.

(6) When the registration period expires, RNIDS deactivates the .cp6 domain name.

(7) After an additional 30-day redemption period, the .cp6 domain name will no longer be registered.

(8) If the registrant renews the registration during the redemption period, the start of the renewed registration is counted as the first day after the expiry of the previous registration period.

Transferring a .cpб domain between accredited registrars Article 14

(1) Accredited registrars must give the registrant the right to choose another accredited registrar (hereinafter: new accredited registrar) for the .cp6 domain names which the registrant has registered or renewed.

(2) The accredited registrar must cooperate with the registrant, the new accredited registrar and RNIDS during the .cp6 domain name transfer process.

Transferring the registration of a .cpб domain Article 15

(1) A registrant may submit a request to transfer the registration of a .cp6 domain to a new registrant to RNIDS through the accredited registrar responsible for the domain.

(2) Alongside the .cp6 domain name registration transfer request, the original registrant must also send the accredited registrar a document confirming their identity and a certified statement confirming that they agree to transfer the rights to the new registrant and authorising RNIDS to carry out the transfer.

(3) RNIDS issues confirmation of receipt of the .cp6 domain name registration transfer request.

(4) RNIDS must activate .cp6 domain registration transfer within no more than 24 hours of confirming receipt of the request to transfer the registration of the .cp6 domain.

(5) The .cp6 domain name registration transfer is registered when RNIDS enters the transfer into the WHOIS database of the .cp6 IDN ccTLD registry.

(6) RNIDS will transfer the registration of an .cp6 domain name only after the delivery of the documents in paragraph 2 and after the new registrant supplies consent to accept the registration of the .cp6 domain name.

(7) In transferring the registration, the registration of the .cp6 domain by the previous registrant is revoked and the registration of the new registrant commences, the moment the change is entered into the WHOIS database for the .cp6 IDN ccTLD registry.

Payment for .cp6 domain registration services Article 16

(1) A fee is payable for .cp6 domain name registration services as defined in article 4 of these General Terms.

(2) An accredited registrar pays a fee to RNIDS for .cp6 domain registration services on the submission of appropriate requests to RNIDS, and in accordance with the General Terms of the contract on the operation of accredited .cp6 domain registrars and the RNIDS Price List.

Revocation of .cp6 domain registration Article 17

(1) The registration of a .cp6 domain name may be revoked if:

• RNIDS ascertains that the registrant provided incorrect or incomplete registration information in his or her application to register or amend a .cp6 domain, or did not announce changes to .cp6 domain registration information in timely fashion, except when incorrect or incomplete information was an obvious mistake;

• it has not been possible to establish contact with a .cp6 domain name registrant or administrative contact 45 days after the first attempt of RNIDS to establish contact, or if the registrant, leaving his or her address, or registered office in Serbia, does not appoint as the administrative contact a person who has an address, or registered office, in Serbia;

• the registrant submits a request to cancel the .cp6 domain name using the RNIDS form and a certified statement confirming that they agree to the cancellation, and this is done on receipt of the statement and document confirming the registrant's identity;

• the registrant does not renew the .cp6 domain name by the expiry of the redemption period as per article 13 paragraph (7);

• RNIDS transfers the registration of the .cp6 domain pursuant to article 15, and at the moment the right is transferred;

• RNIDS-designated arbitration orders the revocation or transfer of the registration of the .cp6 domain, on the day set by that decision;

• a competent court orders the revocation or transfer of the registration of a .cp6 domain, on the day set by that decision;

• the registrant ceases to exist without a legal successor.

(2) The registrant, and the accredited registrar, has no right to a full or partial return of fees for the previous or renewed .cp6 domain name registration when registration is revoked for any of the reasons in paragraph (1) of this article.

Resolving disputes relating to the registration of .cp6 domains Article 18

(1) RNIDS is not authorised to resolve disputes relating to registered .cp6 domains, and directs parties to resolve disputes before the Committee of the Serbian Chamber of Commerce in line with the Rules of Procedure for Proceedings for the Resolution of Disputes Relating to the Registration of .rs Domains, which are applied as appropriate.

(2) In submitting an application for the registration of a .cp6 domain within the .cp6 IDN ccTLD registry, and hence accepting these General Terms, the registrant explicitly agrees to

participate in proceedings before the Committee if a third party submits an application for the resolution of a dispute against the registrant in accordance with the Rules of Procedure mentioned in paragraph 1 of this article. The registrant also declares that he or she will accept the decision of the arbitration council.

Language, authority and applicable law Article 19

(1) These General Terms were compiled in the Serbian language. If the text of these General Terms is available in another language, the authoritative version shall be that in the Serbian language.

(2) RNIDS, the registrant and the accredited registrar shall endeavour to resolve any possible disputes relating to the registration procedure through talks and peaceful means. If this is not possible, the court in Belgrade will have jurisdiction and the applicable law shall be the law of the Republic of Serbia.

Amendments and supplements to the General Terms Article 20

(1) RNIDS reserves the right to amend and supplement these General Terms, and must suitably inform registrants and accredited registrars of these amendments at least 15 days before the date that these amendments enter into force.

Entry into force and commencement of implementation of the General Terms Article 21

These General Terms enter into force on the day of their approval by the Conference of Cofounders of RNIDS, and shall be implemented from the commencement of registration of .cp6 domains within the .cp6 IDN ccTLD registry.
