Dear members of the local Internet community,

The most important event in 2012, and not just for RNIDS, was the launch of the new Cyrillic ccTLD, .CPE. Now anyone who wants to, whether in Serbia or in the diaspora, can express their virtual identity in official, national script.

RNIDS in brief

2012



The Register of National Internet Domain Names of Serbia Foundation (RNIDS, for short) is a professional, non-governmental, non-profit foundation, established in order to administer the Central Register for the .RS and .CPE (pronounced: .SRB) national top-level domains.

RNIDS is run by the Conference of Co-founders, the Board of Governors and the Director. Any legal entity or sole trader registered in Serbia may become a RNIDS Co-founder. At the end of 2012, RNIDS had 61 co-founders and 37 accredited registrars of national internet domains.

RNIDS manages five domain spaces in each of the two country code top-level domains (.RS, .CO.RS, .ORG.RS, .EDU.RS and .IN.RS, and .CPE, .ПР.СРЕ, .OPГ.СРЕ, .OEP.CPE and .OД.СРЕ). Management of the second-level domains intended for academic institutions (.AC.RS and .AK.CPE) has been delegated to the **Academic Network of Serbia**, while SLDs for use by government departments (.GOV.RS and .УПР.СРЕ) have been delegated to the **Administration for Joint Services of Republic Bodies**.

RNIDS manages the national Internet domains of the Republic of Serbia by decision of ICANN dated 11th September 2007 (for the .RS domain) and 21st April 2011 for the .CP5 domain.

Important dates for RNIDS are:

- Anniversary of the .CP5 domain, marking its launch on 27th January 2012
- Anniversary of the .RS domain, marking its launch on 10th March 2008
- RNIDS Day, marking its founding on 8th July 2006

RNIDS' corporate slogan is:

The Home of Domestic Domains.

Our ongoing activities with the local Internet community include:

- DIDS Serbian Internet Domains Day
- 4PI Programme supporting projects to popularise the Internet

As a national Internet domain name registry, RNIDS is a member of **CENTR**, and works together with **ICANN**. Delegates of RNIDS regularly take part in ICANN and CENTR's events and conferences and RNIDS also cooperates with RIPE, WIPO and IGF.

ACCREDITED registrars





An accredited registrar (AR) is a company or sole trader registered in Serbia who has been granted authority by RNIDS to carry out .RS and .CP6 domain registrations for end-users.

Accredited registrars are business entities in the ICT sector which meet the technical conditions required by RNIDS and have signed an agreement with RNIDS.

The business of internet domain name registration involves:

- registering domain names
- changing domain name registration information
- domain name registration renewals
- transferring domain names between accredited registrars
- transferring domain name registrations between registrants
- activating Whois privacy for domain name contact information
- revoking (deleting) domain names

RNIDS provides technical, training and marketing support to accredited registrars through ongoing training and promotional programmes. Most accredited registrars are also members of the RNIDS Conference of Co-founders.

NATIONAL domains





The Republic of Serbia has two national Internet domains of equal importance: .RS and .CPb. The first domain is a ccTLD (a country code top-level domain), and the other, the Cyrillic domain, is an IDN ccTLD (Internationalized Domain Name), i.e. one using a script other than the English Latin alphabet.

.RS and .CPE domain names registration services are provided to end-users (registrants) by accredited registrars, while RNIDS is tasked with managing the Central Registry of national domains.

Disputes relating to registered .RS and .CPE domains are resolved before the Serbian Chamber of Commerce Committee for the Resolution of Disputes Relating to the Registration of National Internet **Domains.** The Committee is based at Resavska 15, Belgrade.

RS and .CPE domain names can be registered within **five domain spaces,** depending on the type of user:

.RS .СРБ for all interested users regardless of whether they are legal entities or individuals, local or foreign

.co.rs .ПР.СРБ

for business users, regardless whether they are local or foreign legal entities or sole traders

.ORG.RS .ОРГ.СРБ

for business users who are not-for-profit organisations, regardless of whether they are local or foreign legal entities

.EDU.RS .ОБР.СРБ for business users who are educational institutions and organisations, regardless of whether they are local or foreign legal entities

.IN.RS .ОД.СРБ for private individuals, regardless of whether they are local or foreign

The last two .RS and .CPE domain spaces are intended for specific users:

.AC.RS

.АК.СРБ

intended for the academic, scientific and research network of Serbia, delegated to the Academic Network of Serbia (AMRES)

.GOV.RS

.УПР.СРБ


intended for government departments of the Republic of Serbia, delegated to the Administration of Joint Services of Republic Bodies (UZZPRO)






DOMAIN statistics

Increase in the number of registered .RS domain names in 2012




2012 saw a growth in the number of .RS domain names of about 9% as compared to 2011. October saw a growth of about 13% as compared to the previous year, as a result of the October and November promotional campaigns.

Percentage of renewed .RS domain names in 2012




The monthly percentage of .RS domain names renewals corresponds directly to the number of domains coming up for renewal in the given period. The greatest number of renewals is in March and September, the months when the greatest number of domain names expire.

Increase in the number of registered .CPE domain names in 2012



The .CPE ccTLD was not launched until 27th January 2012. There was rapid growth in July and August, which can be attributed to the end of the priority registration period and the commencement of unlimited registrations of .CPE domain names.

Percentage of renewed .RS domain names in 2010-2012



The increase in the percentage of renewals in the .RS domain space shows a positive trend not exceeding 1.5%. This level of growth is considered sustainable and is close to the rate achieved by the most successful Internet registries around the world.





Ratio of registered .RS domain names (legal entities vs. private individuals)




The ratio of legal entities to private individuals registering .RS domains indicates that three out of four domain name registrants are organisations.

Ratio of subdomains in the .RS domain space on 31st December 2012




The figures for registered subdomain names within the .RS domain space show that users most often choose .RS and .CO.RS domain names. Similar is true for the equivalent .CPB domain spaces.

A comparative analysis of the population size and the total number of registered national TLDs in countries in the region shows significant opportunity for further growth in the number of domain names registrations in Serbia (the number of .RS domain names is indicated).

Management of the .RS domain was only delegated to RNIDS in 2007, which makes it, together with the Montenegrin domain, the youngest ccTLD in the region. The Montenegrin domain, .ME, differs somewhat in the fact it shares features with gTLDs as compared to other ccTLDs.



SECTOR for ICT Services

The ICT sector began making preparations for registrations of .CPE domains to commence in November 2011, and by the time registrations began on 27th January 2012 all the domain registration software upgrades were complete and, in cooperation with accredited registrars, the system was subjected to a full live test. All technical preparations had likewise been made in time for the commencement of open .CPE domain registrations, and from 1st August 2012 it has been possible to register these with no limitations.

In recent years attacks on DNS servers have become increasingly common, with techniques being developed to intercept DNS messages and redirect users to web locations they did not request. This can be used to steal personal data, information on bank accounts and credit card numbers, which can then be misused. Currently the most advanced method for protecting the data sent by DNS servers to users is called DNSSEC. RNIDS organised a two-day workshop at the Moskva Hotel in Belgrade on 16th and 17th May on the topic Implementing DNSSEC, with speakers Patrik Wallström and Rickard Bellgrim from the Swedish national registry. The workshop was international in flavour and brought together some thirty participants, all of whom are professionally involved in installing and maintaining DNS servers.

Since its founding, RNIDS has made it a priority to continually develop its technical capacities with the aim of raising the standard of services and ensuring they continue uninterrupted, even when individual equipment is faulty or cannot be used for any other reason. During 2012, the following upgrades were

- New equipment was added to the data centres and the RNIDS Office: a storage server, additional working memory and new comms equipment to increase security levels. During June and July new firewall equipment was procured and brought online, significantly improving the security of the system and of the national Internet domain user database.
- Secondary DNS anycast services were procured. **Netnod** was chosen as our partner, a Swedish company with more than 60 DNS servers in its global network, which from September 2012 onward has been providing services for all DNS zones managed by RNIDS. This partnership has secured a very high level of reliability and efficiency for the DNS services provided to Internet users by RNIDS.

In cooperation with the Belgrade University Faculty of Electrical Engineering, a **configuration analysis of DNS servers** housed with accredited registrars was carried out in order to further improve the DNS service and avoid possible DNS problems in Serbia.

SECTOR FOR General and Legal Affairs

The Statutory Affairs working group, together with the RNIDS Office and a consultant from KPMG, put together a draft Statute and dependent documents relating to the management of RNIDS, respecting the principles of corporate governance, as applied to a not-for-profit and non-governmental organisation.

The regular meeting of the Conference of Cofounders was held on 26th May, at which the new Statute of the RNIDS Foundation was passed, with the following changes:

- Provisions for consistent implementation of changes in legal documents
- More effective prevention of conflicts of interest
- Clear delineation of responsibilities of individual management members
- Greatest possible transparency of operations
- Stricter election criteria for Board of Governors members and RNIDS Director
- New standing Statutory Committee introduced, and internal auditor

At the **repeated meeting of the Conference of Cofounders**, held **22**nd **December**, the following documents were approved:

- Conference of Co-founders Rules of Procedure
- Rulebook for election procedure and operation of Statutory Committee
- Rulebook for determining the fee schedule
- General terms and conditions for national domain name registrations
- General terms and conditions for operation of accredited national domain name registrars

An important change to the **General terms and conditions for national domain name registrations** is an extension to the redemption grace period after domain registration expiry. After the thirty days have expired, during which the domain continues to function, the registrant now has an additional 15 days to renew, during which the domain is inaccessible to Internet users.

In the General terms and conditions for operation of accredited national domain name registrars

it has been made explicit that accredited registrars shall not engage in domain name speculation nor in the registration of domain names for the purposes of "parking".

A number of **new human resources documents** were introduced during 2012, those being:

- Employee rules of procedure
- Rulebook for job classification and organisation
- Rulebook for employee job performance evaluation
- Rulebook for employee disciplinary responsibility
- Decision on the specification of the employee evaluation form

A new model contract of employment was approved, which all RNIDS employees have signed.

In 2012 was held 31 meeting of the Board of Governors, at which a total of 100 decisions and other instruments were passed. New rules of procedure for the Board of Governors, for project financing and delegations travelling on official business.

Representatives of RNIDS took regular part in the **CENTR Legal and Admin workshops** held during 2012. In April, talks were held for students at the Union University Faculty of Law about the national Internet domains, the work of RNIDS and the registration of .RS and .CPE domains.

Three disputes connected with national Internet domain registrations were initiated and resolved.



SECTOR for Finance

At the beginning of the year we implemented the **Cash Flow** application, used to track the movement of money in and out according to budget lines (codes in the Financial Plan) and to gain an overview both of the achievement of income targets and of expenses, and the purposes for which funds are spent.

In April an **executive finance director** came on board and **three revisions of the 2012 Financial Plan** were carried out to take account of changes in the business environment.

Despite the reduced profitability that is characteristic of a non-profit organisation, significant growth in operating income (more than 12% in the period 2012/2011) and assets (over 5% in the period 2012/2011) was achieved.

On the other hand, net debt is increasingly negative (a growth of almost 30% in the period 2012/2011), and so too is the ratio of net debt to EBITDA, which is testament to RNIDS' increasing solvency.

As regards liquidity, this is more or less at the 2011 level, i.e. very sound. These indicators would be even more positive, except for the idiosyncrasies of RNIDS' business model. To explain further, owing to the way the Foundation does business, there are no classic short-term liabilities (operating liabilities, short-term financial liabilities and other short-term liabilities), rather there are mostly deferred revenues – unused advanced payments for domain registrations, comprising almost 90% of short-term liabilities.

If we also note the fact that the percentage of debt (long-term debt and short-term financial liabilities) contributing to liabilities is equal to zero then we can say that RNIDS has no problems with liquidity and solvency.

SECTOR FOR Business Development

During 2012 there was an initiative to revive a longstanding idea: to team up with the mobile network operators and have them create packages that included **national internet domain names that the user could register, from the options available to private individuals** (.RS, IN.RS, .CPB, OД.CPB and their various combinations).

RNIDS became an **associate member of IAB Serbia** (the Interactive Advertising Bureau).

Towards the end of 2012, an Internet survey was created with two sets of questions - one aimed at domain users (both private individuals and organisations) and the other at those registering domains on their behalf or advising them which domain to choose (agencies, developers, web designers, etc.). Its purpose was to determine the factors that most commonly influence the choice of domain and to see who most often takes the decision. The response was unsatisfactory, but based on 132 surveys filled in, there is reason to believe that price was not the most important factor when choosing a domain for those who took the survey, and that they got most of their information from industry-specific media.



MEDIA APPEARANCES

During the year, on various occasions, there were numerous guest appearances and interviews in all the major IT and business magazines, as well as on many radio and television programmes. Analysis of all the reports our electronic clipping provider collected during 2012 shows that RNIDS was most often represented by Predrag Milićević (53 times), Branislav Anđelić (24 times), Mirjana Tasić (22 times) and Vojislav Rodić (17 times). Besides guest appearances and interviews, **original articles** went out in the media, such as "New Challenges and Opportunities" (A. Kostadinović), "Find Me Easy", "From Google's Point of View" and "The Internet's Homeless, Tenants and Homeowners", articles about the Cyrillic script on the Internet, about small and medium-sized companies online, domain disputes and more.

Number of media reports by topic




According to the analysis of the 956 reports our electronic clipping service collected, the number of reports on Internet portals comprised 54% of the total reports, printed media 35%, and the broadcast media 11%, but the greatest value was still derived from the broadcast media, with RTS 1 at the forefront, with a value of €189,630 (the value of an appearance represents the equivalent cost of advertising time in the individual media).

During 2012, primary and planned publicity was dominant, with an average approval rating of 1.3, meaning that articles were mostly directly related to RNIDS and reported on media campaigns planned and carried out by RNIDS, while RNIDS is mentioned less frequently in the wider context.




Total number of media reports in 2012 by quarter




Value of media appearance (in thousands of EUR)



Number of media reports in 1st quarter




Number of media reports in 2nd quarter




Most frequent topics: The .CPB domain and DIDS 2012

DIDS **2012**

The third Annual conference on the development of the Internet within the Serbian .RS and .CPE domains DIDS 2012 was held on 22nd March at the Moskva Hotel in Belgrade. Serbian Internet Domains Day, organised by RNIDS, brought together 25 speakers from Serbia and abroad and 230 participants. All the participants received a CD called Virtually Everything for Cyrillic, containing a great many useful tools to help in the everyday use of Cyrillic on the PC.

In the first session, titled "New on the Internet at Home and Abroad", moderated and introduced by Vladimir Radunović of the DiploFoundation, Khaled Fattal, chair and general director of the Multilingual Internet Group, shared his experiences of the significance and the development of localised content and of internationalised domains in the Arab world. After that came guest from Russia Georgiy Georgiyevski, sales director of the Coordination Center for the .RU and .PΦ TLD, speaking about their experiences with the Russian Cyrillic Internet domain Vojislav Rodić, Chair of the RNIDS Conference of Cofounders, gave a retrospective of RNIDS' activities over the last year. At the end of this block, Zoran Stanojević, journalist and coordinator of the RTS Internet portal, presented the results and the significance of 4PI 2011.

The second block was titled "Cyrillic on the Internet, the Internet in Cyrillic", and Tamara Vučenović coordinated discussion between local experts, each approaching the topic from the perspective of their own field: technology, philology, library science, law, design, culture and education and science. Slobodan Marković and Mihailo Stefanović supplied technical explanations of the functioning of Cyrillic Internet domains on different computer and server platforms. Mirko Marković talked about the use of the Internet in libraries in Serbia and the significance of Cyrillic and the .CPE domain for library databases and descriptors. The topic of the digital humanities, Cyrillic and the Internet as a platform for the exchange of knowledge was tackled by Toma Tasovac in the form of a video presentation, which also looked at the Digital Library of Serbian Cultural Heritage.

Olivera Stojadinović presented the "Gift of Cyrillic" project and talked about the issues surrounding Cyrillic typography on the Internet. Vladimir Marić spoke on the topic of protecting intellectual property online, with special emphasis on the Cyrillic script and protecting brands in Cyrillic.

"Successful Projects in the .RS Domain" was the topic of the third session of the Conference, moderated by Miloje Sekulić and Ivan Ćosić. Eleven websites were presented that provide content or services significant for the local Internet ecosystem: www.epilion.rs, www.greendesign.rs, www.infolink.rs, www.telegraf.rs, www.tarzanija.rs, www.tetka.rs, www.buzzilla.rs, www.karijera.mingl.rs, www.uplatnica.rs, www.srbodroid.rs and the Read to Me project.



PROMOTIONAL IMPACT:

The live video stream from DIDS was available on 4 different websites. The conference was supported by 23 sponsors, and there was a total of 79 media reports, of which 39 were on the Internet, 9 on television, 5 on radio stations and 26 in the printed media.

4PI **2012**

For a third year, RNIDS awarded grants as part of the **2012 Programme supporting projects to popularise the Internet** (called 4PI 2012 for short). Grants were awarded to **seven Internet projects** to be implemented on one of the two Serbian national internet domains (.RS or .CPB). Winning entries were awarded funding to a total value of 3,500,000 dinars, with 31st July as the deadline for projects to be completed.

The chosen entries were expected to contribute to increasing the amount of socially relevant content in the Serbian Internet space. The list of awarded entries covered a diverse range of content and activities: an Internet maritime safety school, media literacy training, an electronic dictionary, a youth health portal, ICT training for teachers, development of Internet entrepreneurship and use of QR codes.

A **special Internet site** was also created for 4PI this year, used for promoting the programme, entering projects and presenting those selected.



On 5th October, an informal meeting was held called 4PI TweetUp, attended by around 30 bloggers, journalists and Twitter users who received first-hand information on the launch of the 4PI project.



The RNIDS Project Evaluation Committee for 4PI 2012 consisted of:

A total of **72 projects** meeting all the formal conditions were entered for 4PI 2012. There were fewer entries than in 2011 because this time private individuals were not able to participate - only organisations and sole traders registered in the Republic of Serbia prior to 1st September 2011 were able to submit projects.

The deadline for submissions was 23rd November and the committee took its decision on 21st December.



The winning projects were presented on 26th **December** in the Moskva Hotel before representatives of RNIDS, the Committee, the winning applicants and the media.

PROMOTIONAL CAMPAIGN for the .CPB domain

Almost all of 2012 was focussed on the **launch of the** .**CPБ domain**. A campaign was carried out which included advertising via vignettes in the daily papers and computing and business magazines. Contextual Internet ad space was targeted via the E-Target network of websites, and on 25th January a **promotional site** was launched at **ььь.срб**.

A press conference on 27th January, the day registrations commenced, was attended by 32 journalists. In the space of just 4 days, from 27th to 30th January, there were 104 media reports on the .CPE domain.



Many promotional articles went out and representatives of RNIDS gave interviews and statements to the printed media and made numerous appearances on television and radio. News about the .CPE domain was also forwarded to CENTR, who distributed it further via their own channels.

A promotional event was also organised, at Belgrade's **Ada Ciganlija** river resort, on 21st **July**, with promotional assistants moving amongst visitors on roller skates dressed in .CPE t-shirts and baseball caps, providing a visual reminder of the .CPE domain. The whole campaign was also backed up with social media activity (Twitter and Facebook).

Two days before the .CP5 domain was fully opened for registrations, on ${\bf 30}^{\rm th}$ July, a meeting was held for



Twitter users, bloggers and journalists and .CPE t-shirts were handed out to them. The Twitter event hashtag was **#SrbUp**.


A press conference was held on 1st August, the day that the .CPE domain was fully opened for registrations, at the Belgrade Media Centre.

Domain names on the .CP5 domain that had been reserved for use by state administration bodies were released and made available to the market for registration. .RS domain users who had not taken the opportunity by 1st August to register one of the .CP5 domains on offer at a special reduced price were given the opportunity to choose and register some other currently available .CP5 domain, still at a reduced price.



Certain technical problems that had persisted after the .CPE ccTLD was launched were resolved. For example, at RNIDS' request, the Firefox web browser was upgraded to correctly display .CPE domain names, and the developers officially announced that the software had been fixed.

Serbian .CP5 ccTLD has one special advantage - it is the only Internet domain in the world that allows web addresses to be written exactly as they are pronounced. Thanks to the unique feature of the Serbian Cyrillic alphabet whereby each sound is represented by a single letter, .CP5 addresses, as opposed to the many domain names written in the English alphabet, are always pronounced exactly as they are written. That is why the slogan of the .CP5 domain is: Link as you speak!



PROMOTIONAL CAMPAIGN Find Me Easy

During October and November a promotional campaign for the national TLDs was organised, called "Nadi me lako"(Find Me Easy), which resulted in a visible increase in demand for domains. The invitation to participate was taken up by 20 of the 37 accredited registrars, and 9 ARs also created special landing pages on their sites to fit in with the campaign. RNIDS used this campaign to remind companies and individuals that by registering all the necessary .RS and .CP5 domains they could fully protect their identity or brand in Serbia's Internet space, whilst at the same time defining the geographic region which their website primarily targets.



The hub for all communication was the **promotional** website, explaining the reasons to have both a .RS and a .CPE domain, how to choose them properly and where and how to register them. The site also gave general instructions on how to create a website and ways to promote yourself effectively online. Besides advertisements in PC and business magazines and contextual advertisements on busy sites and portals, a number of **promotional articles** were published.

One article was on the topic of **country code TLDs from Google's point of view**, inspired by the fact that 97% of Google Internet users from Serbia search for sites targeted to the local, Serbian market. Google treats search keywords written in Cyrillic and the

Latin alphabet equally, regardless of which script is used to enter the search terms, and search results favour sites registered on the national internet domains, .RS and .CP5.

Another article was published on the Internet's homeless, tenants and homeowners. This referred to individuals or companies without an Internet presence who are practically the "homeless of the Internet". In order to secure some kind of roof over their heads, they decide to take up free residence on a social network, and there they live as Internet tenants. However, if they really want a place they can call their own on the Internet, then they need to build on their own Internet domain - only then can they become "Internet homeowners".



PROMOTIONAL IMPACT

October saw 1,796 new .RS domain names registrations, almost 13% more than in the same month in 2011. However, had the previous year's trend continued we would have expected a 6% fall, that is only around 1,500 new .RS domain names registrations, so the real rise against the trend was almost 20%. In addition, the overall state of the economy should be kept in mind - tens of thousands of companies closed their doors in 2012, a trend directly affecting demand for domains, which makes the positive impact of this campaign all the more significant.



TESLA'S Vision of the Internet

The Tesla's Vision of the Internet multimedia project, inspired by Nikola Tesla's World System scheme from 1900 was carried out together with the O3one Gallery and the Nikola Tesla Museum. The goal was to associate RNIDS with the name and work of Nikola Tesla and in doing so access media outlets where we had previously not featured, both in the region and the diaspora. The author of the Tesla's Vision of the Internet project was Lazar Bošković, and the exhibition was designed by Dušan Vojnov of Orange Studio.

The project began with an exhibition at the O3one Gallery from 9th to 13th July and continued with a multimedia display called Tesla 3 in 1 (one of the three parts being Tesla's Vision of the Internet) at the Vračar municipal council gallery. This exhibition was officially closed on 16th August in the company of Dr Dennis Wilcox, one of the leading PR experts of today and a great admirer of the work of Tesla. All content from the exhibition is also available in the form of an infographic published on a purpose-built website, both in English and in Serbian.







PROMOTIONAL IMPACT

241 media reports were clipped covering both exhibitions. The exhibition made the news on almost all national television and radio stations and in the national printed media, as well as in magazines that do not often report on RNIDS' activities. A Google search at the time, for the Serbian term "Teslina vizija Interneta", an expression which did not exist prior to 5th July, returned several hundred thousand results. Apart from payment for printing of display boards for the exhibition, the remainder of the work was carried out as part of RNIDS' regular activities.

OTHER activities

Infographic: Benefits of a .RS domain



A competition was held to design an infographic showing the benefits of the .RS domain, organised by RNIDS in cooperation with the community of designers on the Internet portal **GreenDesign.rs.** The winning entry came from Belgrade designer **Marko Živanović**, among the more than 40 designs that were entered.

The infographic presented all five benefits of the .RS national Internet domain in a simple and visually striking way,

those being: presence in the Serbian market, availability of domain names, protection for identity and brand, site visitor security and sense of belonging to the local Internet community.

A promotional event for the infographic was held on 14th December, attended by around forty bloggers, Twitter users and journalists, tracked by the Twitter hashtag #InfografikUp.
